Stiltsville's storied history as a renegade village-on-stilts sits a mile offshore Key Biscayne and is the romantic subject of authors, poets and screenwriters. It was home to some of Miami's most infamous parties where Florida's "bad boy" elite partied alongside Governor Roy Collins.

Stiltsville's heyday in the 1940s and 1950s made it "THE place where lawyers, bankers, politicians, and other moneyed, well-connected Miamians came to drink, relax and kick back. Law enforcement periodically visited the area, looking for vice activities." More recently, Stiltsville was featured in the television series, Miami Vice with Don Johnson.

Fast forward about 30 years and our own Sonny and Rico (aka Alberto Dosal and John Kozyak) won't be solving any crimes (or committing any), but will entertain you with stone crabs and steaks cooked to perfection as well as wine pairings by Chef and Sommelier for the day John Kozyak. **You and seven guests will get the party started with some bubbly on Pat Sessions' 52' Hatteras Sport fisherman, Big Daddy.** Kick back, relax and watch the beautiful Florida sun sink into the sea. Leave your cares on land and prepare to have the time of your life with some pretty great hosts. 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LOT 1 | SCREAMING EAGLE CABERNET SAUVIGNON, 2013, (98-100, RP)

Value: \$2,500

Screaming Eagle is a true cult wine which is almost impossible to get. The first release of 200 cases was in 1995 using 1992 fruit. Robert Parker gave it a 99 rating, and by 2000 there were 4,000 people on the waiting list. Screaming Eagle remains a small production (approximately 600 cases/year) wine.

Winemaker's Notes

What a back-to-back pair of vintages! I assume one would have to go back to 2002 and 2001 to find two Screaming Eagles this compelling. The 2013 appears set for 25-30 years of longevity. There is something magical about this Oakville parcel on the valley floor just under the looming hillsides of such wineries as Phelps, Bacchus and Dalla Valle's Maya, and across the street from the Rudd Estate, Plumpjack, etc.



LOT 2 | QUINTESSA RED WINE VERTICAL (2008 / 2009 / 2010) IN WOODEN BOX

"Quintessa, like all classic wines of the world, bears the same name as the vineyard from which it is made. Our goal is to produce the best expression of this extraordinary vineyard each year. In broad terms, Quintessa is a red meritage wine. Each year, it is a blend that can include some or all of the five varietals grown on the estate: Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Petit Verdot and Carmenere. The vineyard's diversity provides us wide stylistic options for the wine. Fruit from each component block of Quintessa is harvested, sorted, then gravity fed into either oak or stainless steel fermentation tanks. Once fermentation and maceration are complete, each block wine is aged separately for up to two years in French oak barrels in our caves. After this aging period the components are brought together and the final Quintessa blend is created. The wine is then bottled and laid down for yet another year before release. Although each vintage is unique, we have discovered that finesse and elegance best express the character of the vineyard and as such, we blend for harmony, balance, and length of flavors. Above all, our objective is to make Quintessa a delicious wine that is complementary to food."

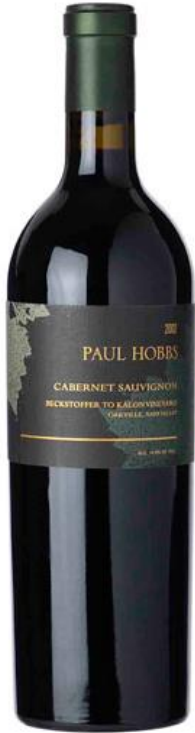

The 2010 boasts superb depth, power and richness in a weighty, brooding style that is the essence of To Kalon. A huge, intense finish rounds things out in style. Anticipated maturity: 2020-2032.”

In this vintage, Dunn’s Lake Vineyard, the last parcel on the property to ripen, accounts for nearly 50% of the blend. Anticipated maturity: 2014-2029. Randy Dunn’s two 2009s are quite different from each other in this vintage, something that isn’t always the case. That’s good news for Dunn fans, as the 2009 Napa Valley Cabernet Sauvignon is one of the estate’s few recent releases that won’t take ages to be accessible.”

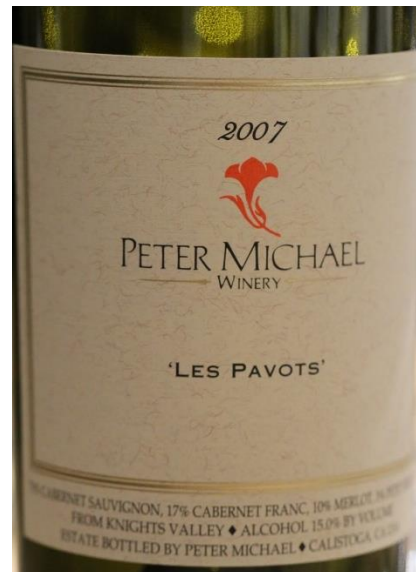
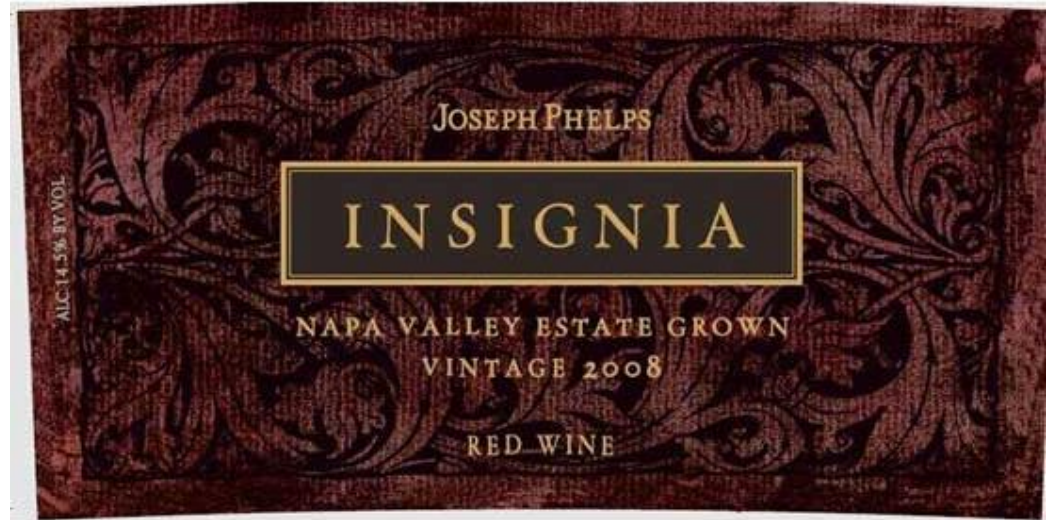

Phelps is best known for its flagship Napa Valley blend of red Bordeaux varietal. Insignia, first produced in 1974 and awarded *Wine Spectator's* "Wine of the Year" in 2005, Insignia is widely regarded as a qualitative benchmark for California winemaking.

James Berry, 2008 (Two Bottles)

"James Berry Vineyard remains one of the iconic grand cru sites of California, an extraordinary block of limestone soil spread over a moderately steep hill. Produced from a tiny crop from the 55 acre James Berry Estate Vineyards, the 2008 is extremely impressive." RP

"Layers of dark fruit meld into flowers, mint, sweet spices, menthol, eucalyptus and plums, with marvelous density and harmony. Co-owner of Thistle Wines, Laura Jennison, is the daughter of our NPF Chair 2003-2007, Paul Orefice. Thistle is a small, family-run winery whose wines are not distributed outside the Pacific Northwest, so this lot is special to us in many ways.

In her own words, “It all started with a glass of pinot noir. And from there things got a little crazy. A passion for wine developed into a search for the perfect place to make it. After looking up and down the West Coast, we settled on Oregon as the ideal place to pursue our dream.”

Laura has selected of six consecutive vintages of Thistle Dundee Hill Pinot Noir.

It includes two bottles each of 2009-2014.



LOT 7 | SINE QUA NON CULT WINE, SIX BOTTLES

“**Sine Qua Non** (also known as **SQN**) is a California cult winery known for its Rhône style blends, a tendency to avoid repetition, and a very limited production of wine that is highly difficult to obtain, with 100% of all releases allocated and directly sold to a carefully managed mailing list.”

“And so our goal has been and always will be to understand Mother Nature’s often oblique ways and (re)act accordingly so that we may create wines that express all that Nature has so generously given us. Five Shooter Central Coast Syrah, 2010 - 98 points Robert Parker's Wine Advocate

The 2010 Syrah Five Shooter is straight up gorgeous. A massive wine that somehow holds everything together, it offers a wild array of cassis, blackberry, white chocolate, underbrush and pepper that flows to a full-bodied, layered Syrah that has masses of fine tannin and enough substance to evolve for decades.

Pictures Grenache, 2007 - 97 points Robert Parker's Wine Advocate

A blend of 87% Grenache, 11.5% Syrah, and 1.5% Viognier, this wine has wonderful floral notes intermixed with black raspberries, black cherries, licorice, graphite and some camphor. In the mouth, more white chocolate notes appear, along with meatiness and some silky tannins.

Covert Fingers Pinot Noir, 2004 - 94 points Robert Parker's Wine Advocate

The 462-case 2004 Pinot Noir Covert Fingers is seamless and elegant, with a ripe, layered profile of sweet cassis, forest floor, licorice and ground herbs. Coming all from the cooler climate Arita Hills Vineyard in the Sta. Rita Hills and completely destemmed, aged in 70% new French oak (the rest in 1-3-year-old barrels), never racked, and bottled unfinned and unfiltered, it’s a full-bodied, beautiful effort that’s drinking at point.

B 20 Syrah, 2008 - 95 points Robert Parker's Wine Advocate

The 2008 Syrah B-20 is a cool, inward wine graced with layers of beautifully delineated, chiseled fruit. This is a distinctly mineral, precise style relative to the more outgoing 2009, but both are striking. Floral notes add lift as the finish turns explosive with a burst of dark fruit, tar, licorice and crushed rocks.

Ventriloquist Central Coast Grenache, 2001

400 cases. Mid ruby, still so much red in the colour for an 15-year-old wine. Complex fruit and liquorice but it is still so surprisingly primary on the nose even though there is the beginning of leather. An hour later, much more undergrowth and not at all primary. Aged quite well but rather fragile once opened, ending up with some orange and spice, but the alcohol sticks out more as the texture has got thinner.

Résisté Central Coast Proprietary White, 2013 - 97 points Robert Parker's Wine Advocate

The 2013 White Wine Résisté is a sensational white from California that's made from 45% Roussanne, 26% Chardonnay, 14% Petite Manseng, 10% Viognier and 5% Marsanne that spent 19 months in 46% new French oak and the balance in concrete eggs and used barrels. Possessing rock-star levels of richness and texture on the palate, with full-bodied depth and power that never seems heavy or cumbersome, it has classic SQN white notes of buttered golden fruits, honeysuckle, honeycomb, toast and white flowers.

LOT 8 | ROCHIOLI VINEYARD, SUMMER PACKAGE

Rochioli Estate Chardonnay, 2013

"Richly caramelized on the nose, the seductive quality of this wine continues on the palate, pushing the boundaries of baked apple and voluptuous body without ever careening over the edge. A classic California Chardonnay from a structured, balanced vintage, it finishes with intriguing minerality."

Rochioli Rosé of Pinot Noir, 2015



This Rosé of Pinot Noir is a mailing list and tasting room only release. It is very limited production and not rated.

It was created by whole cluster pressing and free-run pinot noir juice from our Estate Pinot Noir grapes and adding back just the right amount of traditionally produced Pinot Noir for color. This full-flavored wine has aromas of roses and strawberries. It can be served at room temperature as well as slightly chilled, if you prefer.

LOT 9 | TWO BOTTLES OF OPUS ONE RED WINE, 1999 AND 2000

VINTAGE 1999

Opus One is known for its exquisite texture, and the 1999 vintage is no exception. The wine shows aromas of cassis, cloves and roasted almonds against a creamy texture of soft tannins and round, rich fruit. Offering flavors of plum, cherry and black pepper, the 1999 will be charming in its youth and expressive at maturity.

Wine Spectator 93 Points

"An exquisite, complex, stylish wine, wearing a cloak of earthy, leathery tannins around flavors of mineral, currant, earth and blackberry. Gains intensity and shows its depth and concentration on the finish, which is long and detailed."



VINTAGE 2000

Normal winter rainfall and slightly warmer temperatures in early spring led to an early bud break in Opus One's vineyards, followed by a mild summer. Although veraison was also early, sustained cool temperatures over the summer led to slow ripening and an extended harvest, which started August 26th and concluded on October 27th. With a moderate to deep ruby color, the 2000 Opus One shows aromas of sandalwood, leather, caramel and a hint of anise. Soft and plush in the mouth, the wine offers flavors of plums and black licorice supported by sweet tannins and a long, intense finish.

"Graceful and elegant, but with hidden depths of authority and power. The blackberry, cherry and oak flavors are pretty, but the wine is most notable for its harmony and grace. Tannins play only a supportive role, but they will let this wine age effortlessly."



LOT 10 | PINOT NOIR HORIZONTAL, 2008, FOUR BOTTLES

Kistler Sonoma Coast Pinot Noir, 2008

94 points Stephen Tanzer's International Wine Cellar

Vivid red. Drop-dead gorgeous perfume of raspberry preserves, Asian spices and fresh rose, with a deeper suggestion of violet. Sappy, penetrating and pure, with strikingly intense red fruit flavors underpinned by tangy minerality. Finishes with resonating spiciness and a lingering floral note. This wine's clarity is striking. (5/2011)

Rochioli "Estate" Russian River Valley Pinot Noir, 2008

90-92 points Robert Parker's Wine Advocate

The delicious 2008 Pinot Noir Estate (just under 4,000 cases produced) is one of the finest generic Pinots one can find from Russian River. It exhibits sweet pomegranate, raspberry, cherry, roasted herb notes along with a hint of smoky oak in its seductive, round, opulent personality. It should drink well for 7-8 years. This is another beautiful portfolio of wines from Tom Rochioli.

Williams Selyem "Westside Road Neighbors" Russian River Valley Pinot Noir, 2008

92 points Stephen Tanzer's International Wine Cellar

Saturated red. Captivating aromas of cherry-cola, pepper, Indian spices, cocoa powder and sandalwood. Then intense, spicy and penetrating in the mouth, with vibrant raspberry and wild strawberry flavors dominating. Finishes pungent, spicy and long, with a palate-staining whiplash of flavor. This calls for another five years of aging. (6/2010)

DuMOL "Estate" Russian River Valley Pinot Noir, 2008

94 points Connoisseurs Guide

Right in step with the rest of its mates as far as concentration and depth are concerned, DuMOL's Estate Pinot is charged with an extra spark of enlivening acidity that presently brings a bit of finishing tartness. That said, the wine is generously filled with optimally ripe cherries, impressively layered and decked out with a full sweep of sweet oak, and, while it tightens up at the end, it is limited by nothing more than youth and may prove to be the longest-lived wine of the bunch. (2/2011)



LOT 11 | HAWK AND HORSE VINEYARDS RED HILLS LAKE COUNTY CABERNET SAUVIGNON, 2011, 'LATIGO' CABERNET SAUVIGNON DESSERT WINE, 2011, (375 ML), SIGNED BY EXTRAORDINARY ATTORNEY AND WINE COLLECTOR DAVID BOIES

Certainly one of America's best known trial lawyers (Bush v Gore, 531 U.S. 98; Calif Prop 8), David Boies is also one of the country's most passionate wine collectors. In 1990, Boies, who had collected for decades, bought Hawk and Horse Vineyards located in Lake County, California and consulted Napa luminaries Caymus and Quintessa among others to achieve excellence in the winemaking.

Red Hills Lake County Cabernet Sauvignon, 2011

"A classic beauty, this Cabernet is elegant and balanced. This wine is particularly aromatic, perfumed with aromas of cedar, rose petal and black fruit. Woodsy notes with hints of sweet tobacco, cocoa and blackberry and pepper are complemented by a rich and luscious mouth-feel."

'Latigo' Cabernet Sauvignon Dessert Wine, 2010 - 375 ml

"This is a dessert wine made in the port style; harvested late and fortified with alembic Brandy. Beautiful dark amber-red jewel tones with deep sultry aromas of ripe roses, delicate smoke and cocoa. Flavors of smooth, rich, black chocolate cherries, pipe tobacco, currants and caramel delight the palate. Balanced tannins and acidity lend structure. Scented and intensely concentrated; perfect as an after dinner drink or sip with your favorite chocolate! Cigar lover's delight!"

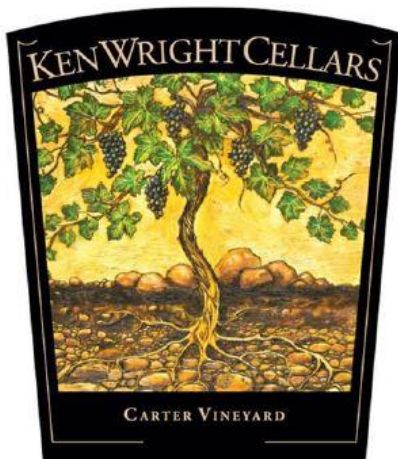

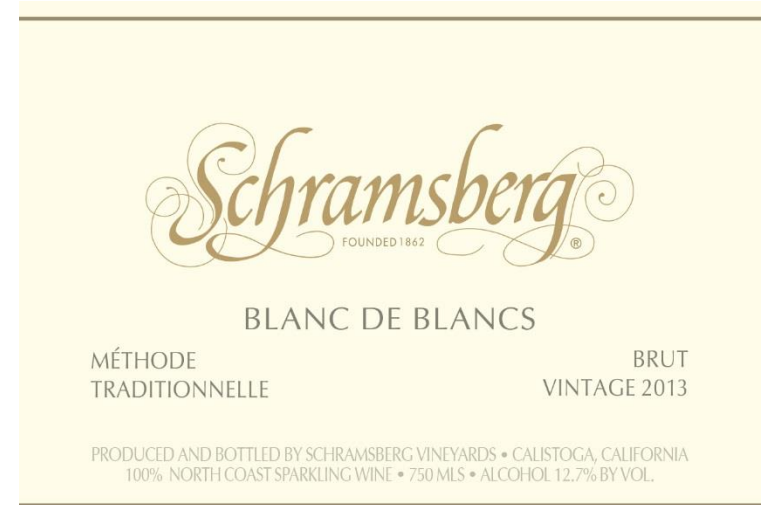
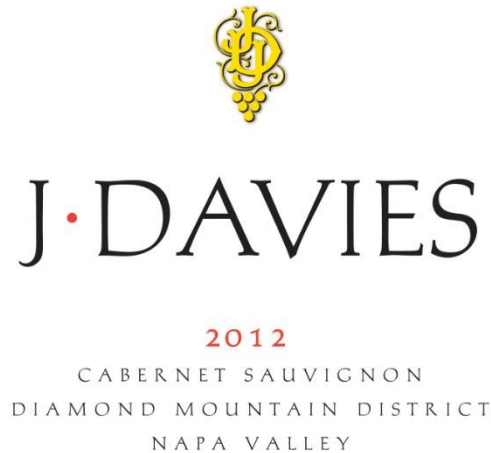

At its best, wine is an expression of place, and the little slice of land on which Grace Family Vineyards Cabernet Sauvignon is grown is certainly exceptional, even for the Napa Valley. But wine is also a reflection of the people who make it, and that starts with the farming and stewardship of the land. Radically dense spacing makes the vines work harder to do the one thing on their minds—make fruit—and that leads to a wine that is more keenly in tune with the land. Farming the estate naturally is good for the people living and working there, of course, but it also means that close attention must be paid to the vines at all times so that any potential problems can be nipped in the bud. The more these vines are in balance, the better the fruit, and the better the fruit, the easier it is to make great wine. Grace Family Vineyards' wines have certain signature characteristics: they're elegant, well-balanced, low in alcohol but high in flavor and long-lived.

If Châteaux Margaux made wine on Diamond Mountain, it might well taste like this beauty. 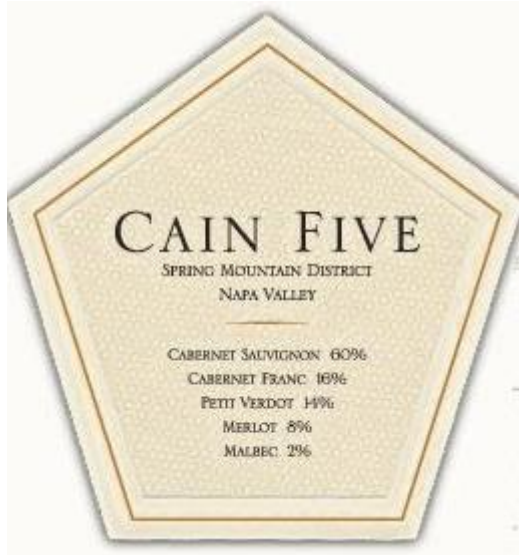

"The 2005 Cain Five shows the emphasis we place on mouth feel: the texture of the tannins is extremely fine, yet distinctly present. The aromas are of fresh red cherries and exotic spices. The wine evolves very well in the open glass, which bodes well for the future. Today, you should decant the wine and sip it carefully. This wine will age gracefully for a long, long time."

As the crow flies, Cain Vineyard and Winery is not far at all from the Napa Valley floor; philosophically, stylistically, it's in a somewhat different place. Located in the Spring Mountain District, the vineyards grow on terraces sculpted around an east-facing amphitheater. Winemaker Chris Howell points out that there's a flower that grows up here that imparts a distinct sweet aroma when the winds blow across the ridge...is that floral aroma also displayed in this still-evolving 2005 Cain "Five," a blend of five major Bordeaux varietals, with complex fruit, maple syrup and intriguing mint aromas. Meticulous winemaking goes into this wine, including: hand picking, gentle destemming, native-yeast fermentation, and manual pressing. The wine completes malolactic fermentation in the barrel, is blended early, is racked barrel-to-barrel, is egg-white fined, and is bottled without filtration.

The tannins are a wonder, and there's just enough acidity to give a balanced tang. Will it age? Yes, but for how long is the question."

Emblem Cabernet Sauvignon, 2013, (1.5L)

The 2013 Emblem Cabernet Sauvignon is a blend of 79% Cabernet Sauvignon, and the rest Merlot, Petit Verdot, Syrah, Zinfandel and Petite Sirah. It sells at a very modest \$35.00. The wine has a deep ruby/purple color, loads of juicy fruit, a medium to full body (about 14.7% natural alcohol), a lush, heady, accessible mouthfeel. This is a steal, and a sleeper of the vintage, and capable of lasting up to a decade or more.

Castelgiocondo Riserva (Brunello di Montalcino), 2004, (1.5L)

93 Points Wine Enthusiast

Beautifully intense and generous. this Riserva Brunello from Frescobaldi's Castelgioconda estate boasts a modern, determined style. Aromas here include black cherry, chocolate, tobacco and spice. In the mouth, this wine is rich, smooth and very persistent.

Giacosa Barbara D'Alba Falletto, 2011, (1.5L)

92 Points MONICA LARNER

The 2011 Barbera d'Alba Falletto demonstrates a sudden jump in aromatic complexity with the careful introduction of Indian spice, leather, toasted nut and tobacco that coexists beautifully with the wine's ripe blackberry fruit. The wine sees two months more oak than the other Barbera d'Alba, and this slight change goes a long way in terms of adding extra texture and density. This wine demonstrates that 2011 was an excellent year for Barbera. Anticipated maturity: 2014-2022.

"The 2013 Cabernet Sauvignon J. Daniel Cuvée is probably the qualitative equivalent of the 2012, but slightly more backward and coiled tight. Coming from three vineyards that Robin Lail uses in Napa Valley: one in Calistoga, one in Oakville and the other on Howell Mountain. This is 100% Cabernet Sauvignon aged 20 months in about three-fourths new French oak. Just under 1,000 cases are produced. The 2013 comes across like a Napa version of the famous Château Montrose in Bordeaux's St.-Estephe. Earthy notes intermixed with chocolate, blackcurrant liqueur, grilled meats and spice are all present in this opaque purple wine. Graphite and floral notes are also present. It is full-bodied and ripe with beautiful purity and superbly integrated acidity, alcohol, wood and tannin. This wine needs another 4-5 years, as it's less dramatic and flamboyant compared to the 2012. It should evolve and age beautifully for 30+ years. -RP"

"Castello delle Regine's climate and hilly terrain with sandy clay soil makes an excellent environment for many red and white grape varieties, especially the indigenous Sangiovese and Merlot, often considered the jewels of the region."

WINES AND GRAPES

The 60 hectares of vineyards are located between 90 and 280 meters, on sandy-clay soil with mixed structure and optimal climatic conditions. Plants, with a density of 5600 vines per hectare, have recently created and are integrating the thirty-year old vineyards. The fermentation occurs in stainless steel tanks from 50 to 110 hl, with punching a controlled temperature. Among the products we mention the finest Podernovo Umbria IGT 2000, a pure Sangiovese aged in barrels and casks; Sangiovese Umbria IGT 2000, aged in barriques for 11 months, concentrated perfumes and strong and of good length; Princeps Umbria IGT 2000, S blend of Cabernet, Merlot and Sangiovese aged in barrels, which evolves with cherry, body and soft tannins, Merlot IGT Umbria 2000 with good hints of ripe fruit, black pepper and cassis.
